HACC names Dr. John J. "Ski" Sygielski as new president

HACC has named a community college president from Oregon as its new leader. Dr. John J. "Ski" Sygielski is slated to take over the leadership of HACC this summer.

Sygielski, a native of Ohio, is currently president of Mt. Hood Community College (MHCC), a multi-campus community college based in the Portland, OR, area. He is also chairman of the board of the American Asociation of Community



Colleges (AACC) – the national association representing the nation's nearly 1,200 community colleges. At HACC, Sygielski will replace Dr. Edna V. Baehre, who left to take a similar job in Napa, Calif. More


