#### **Counseling and Advising News**

Academic Monitoring

Academic Monitoring is a component of our Retention Program that helps identify academic difficulties at an early stage. Lancaster Campus students selected for monitoring are those on suspension reinstatement, enrolled in English 001 or 002, participating in the KEYS program, or registered for Disability Services. In October the counselors and advisors contacted all monitored students who had an unsatisfactory assessment in any area (attendance, assignments, test, overall).

Faculty identified 78 students as unsatisfactory in at least one area when entering data. Attempts to contact all 78 students, and we were able to have conversations in person or by phone, with 75% of the students. This interaction provided the opportunity to discuss a plan of action and encourage the students to take advantage of support services on campus.

#### New Students

New Student Advising and Registration sessions began on November 18 and will continue into summer. Students with no prior college experience are scheduled to attend one of these sessions after the completion of placement testing. They receive information on HACC programs and policies, learn their individual placement test results and recommended courses, and are assisted with registration in HACCweb.

#### **Fall Transfer Days**

Many thanks to everyone who supported and assisted with the Fall Transfer Day event last Wednesday, November 13th. We had representatives from 60+ various colleges and universities along with 150+ students in attendance. Students had their questions answered in a quick and convenient manner regarding the transfer application process for their major schools of interest.
