Ivan and Christine "Chris" Sears donated \$25,000 to the <u>HACC Foundation</u> to establish the Ivan and Christine Sears Fund for Excellence for the Harrisburg Promise.

On Oct. 21, 2008, Northern York County Regional Police Officer **David Tome** was struck and killed by the distracted driver of a vehicle while investigating a fatal accident that had occurred.

Officer Tome had served with pride and honor with the Northern York County Regional Police Department for more than five years. He is survived by his wife, Dody; son, Elijah; and daughter, Joslyn.

In 2003, David graduated from the 83rd Police Academy of HACC, Central Pennsylvania's Community College. To honor his legacy, the **Officer David Tome Memorial Scholarship Fund** was established at HACC by his family and friends. This scholarship will help pre-service cadets to



lessen the financial burden of tuition, fees, books and/or program expenses.

Curtis Aumiller Makes an Impact In and Out of the Classroom

Curtis Aumiller, a HACC Foundation donor, is a HACC graduate from the Respiratory Therapy Program, earning a certificate and continuing his education by earning an associate of arts in 1996. He has earned a Bachelor of Science in Health Arts, a Master of Science in Healthcare Administration and an MBA from University of St. Francis in Joliet, IL. Currently, Curtis is a Ph.D. candidate in public policy and administration of health services at Walden University, and he hopes to be finished in 2020.

Curtis has been a respiratory therapist for over 32 years and has been involved in HACC's Respiratory Program since his graduation from HACC. He started as a lab assistant and then transitioned to a clinical instructor. He started as the director of clinical education in 2003 and became the Respiratory Care Program director in 2012. Curtis is highly credentialed as a



respiratory therapist and serves as an accreditation site visitor for the Commission on Accreditation for Respiratory Care and as a consultant for respiratory therapy. He is also an adjunct professor for University of Cincinnati in their Respiratory Therapy Baccalaureate Degree Completion Program.

On a personal note, Curtis is married and lives in the Camp Hill area. He was the first person in his family to go to college and is the first person in his family to hold a master's degree. Once he earns his doctorate degree, he will be the first in his family to achieve this accomplishment too!

When asked why HACC is important to our community, Curtis responded: "HACC is instrumental to our community because it provides an affordable and accessible resource for people to improve themselves and their lives. The diversity of offerings at HACC allows for those seeking employment degrees, those seeking transfer opportunities and those seeking to just take courses to better their lives or just for fun to all come together in one spot as a community. HACC has something for everyone in our service community, and with the addition of virtual learning, that service community can be anywhere in the world!"

When asked why he contributes to the HACC Foundation, Curtis replied: "I contribute to the HACC Foundation because I want to give back to the organization that helped to transform my life and my career. I donate in the healthcare area because I want to make sure that if myself or a loved one would ever be in need of healthcare, the HACC graduate that is taking care of us has been trained with the latest technology and resources to provide us outstanding care."

Curtis gives the following advice to those who are considering contributing to the HACC Foundation: "Sometimes people think it is hard to donate to the HACC Foundation, or that your little bit doesn't matter. I tell people, if everyone in Harrisburg gave \$1 as a donation, do you know how much money that would be? Do you know how much that \$1 could change so many lives and open opportunities for so many people? By donating to the HACC Foundation, we are investing in our own future as a community so that whatever we need in our lives, there is probably a HACC grad behind it that can help us."
