Recently purchased by the Center for Innovation & Teaching Excellence, the Swivl (shown on page 2) is a handy robotic tool for recording yourself simply and wirelessly using your mo-

bile device. Just plug your smartphone or tablet into the Swivl, place a lanyard around your neck and press record. The Swivl follows the lanyard a full 360 degrees and also has the ability to tilt up and down. It also contains a wireless microphone so you sound great in your videos. An app available

for iOS and Android makes the process of recording, sharing and uploading your video easy for even novices.
